Scope of the audit / review including sites visited	Off-site stage 1 audit as part of initial certification. Comprises an overview of the forest management system including review of: processes for planning, protecting forest values; staff training & risk management; outline of how the concept of continual improvement is realised; procedures and records of internal audit and review; and, list of relevant stakeholders.
Global-Mark summary of the main findings	<p>This stage 1 audit excluded an on-site audit component as there was only one forest block, no active field operations and most importantly safety and travel restrictions existed relating to the COVID-19 Pandemic.</p> <p>The client had a ready to be reviewed Forest Manager System [FMS] at this stage 1 audit, having appointed Brueckner Leech as its consultant with this responsibility. Brueckner Leech has experience in development, implementation and internal auditing of FMS and Chain of Custody systems consistent with the Responsible Wood scheme endorsed by PEFC.</p> <p>In particular, our review identified several factors indicating preparation and system functioning that we consider as noteworthy practices. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stakeholder contact process implemented.</li> <li>• A Forest Management Plan developed.</li> <li>• Multi-generational forestry experience of family business that is the forest manager.</li> </ul> <p>During our overview of the FMS we identified that some additional work on system development and/or implementation may be needed in order to demonstrate conformance at stage 2. The client's consultant has indicated a readiness to address matters mentioned in our report that we believe will require attention prior to certification audit. Hence, the forest manager appears at this stage sufficiently capable to prepare for progress to the certification audit. This stage 2 is set later in 2020 after safety and travel restrictions related to the COVID-19 Pandemic are lifted. In terms of competencies, Global-Mark confirms that its pool of AS 4708 auditors have the experience to conduct the stage 2 phase. Audit duration is estimated as two days on site with half of a day of this associated with field inspection of the one forest block. Active operations are unlikely to be in progress, so the forest will be assessed for the range of forest values. A small amount of additional time might be required to plan consultations with, and consult a sample of relevant stakeholders on the management of the Defined Forest Area.</p>
